

**SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
NOVEMBER 25, 2006 - 9:00 P.M.**

A Special City Council Meeting was conducted during the City of Harvard Sesquicentennial Celebration held at the Moose Lodge, Route 173 West. PROCLAMATION – DESIGNATION OF HARVARD SESQUICENTENNIAL

Mayor Jay Nolan read a proposed Proclamation as follows:

**PROCLAMATION
CITY OF HARVARD SESQUICENTENNIAL**

WHEREAS, one Amos Page on November 25, 1856, did appear before the Honorable J.M. Stroede, County Judge of McHenry County, at Woodstock, Illinois, and obtain his signature and seal on a plat dedicating certain streets in the Village of Harvard, Illinois.

AND WHEREAS, this act did officially enter on the books of this county the fact that there was a Village of Harvard, Illinois, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Six.

AND WHEREAS, this day marks the first One Hundred and Fifty Years of Continuous Existence of the community known as Harvard, Illinois.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this date November 25 of this year 2006 be and is designated as the Harvard Sesquicentennial and that the CITY COUNCIL OF HARVARD, ILLINOIS has invited the general public to gather to commemorate citizens past and to join in the wishes of THIS COUNCIL for continued prosperity for generations future.

IN WITNESS THEREOF, I have set my hand and caused the seal of Harvard, Illinois to be affixed this 25th day of November, 2006.

Moved by Hay, seconded by Marzahl to approve the Proclamation as presented that November 25, 2006, be designated as the Harvard Sesquicentennial.
